GUIDELINES FOR 2007-2008

I. DEFINITIONS AND PURPOSE:

The H & I Subcommittee of the South Coast area of N.A. (SCA H&I) is a group of recovering addicts who believe "That no addict seeking recovery need ever die..." without finding a new way to live. May we provide the necessary services to these addicts.

This concept should always be our primary concern. This helps ensure that when an addict reaches out for recovery we in Narcotics Anonymous will be there for them the way N.A. was there for us.

This committee is directly responsible to the A.S.C. of the S.C.A.N.A. and meets the last Sunday of each month at 5:00pm.

II. COMMITTEE FUNCTIONS:

- A. To carry the NA message and disperse literature to all facilities we currently serve in the S.C.A.N.A.
- B. To conduct a monthly business meeting.
- C. To participate in a regional H&I workshop and/or Learning Day each year.
- D. To submit (3 mos. prior and 3 mos. projected) quarterly budgets to A.S.C.
- E. To review SCA H&I guidelines each March.
- F. To elect officers each July (as per ASC guidelines) (Nominations in June).

III. MEMBERSHIP:

- A. Any member of Narcotics Anonymous may become a member of SCA H&I by attending subcommittee meetings & identifying as an addict. All members must meet 6 months clean time requirement to be considered for H&I service position. However, interested members with a minimum of 90 days uninterrupted clean time may observe a panel if invited by a panel leader.
- B. Voting members consist of SCA H&I sub-committee officers and panel leaders only.

IV. VOTING:

- A. For a panel leader to be voted in they must attend two consecutive H&I meetings immediately prior to being voted in. Priority shall be given to any member who meets the criteria. If no qualified members are interested in the

position, a vote of confidence may be given at their first meeting and they may be voted in the following month.

- B. Nominations for panel leaders or officers may be submitted by voting members verbally. Only 7 voting members must be present to vote on a nomination. However, anyone attending the SCA H&I sub-committee may participate in the discussion process if a nomination is on the floor.
- C. Motions may be submitted by voting members verbally or in writing using a standard motion form provided by SCASC. Only 7 voting members must be present to vote on a motion. However, anyone attending the SCA H&I sub-committee may participate in the discussion process if a motion is on the floor.
- D. Approval of nominations and/or motions will require a 51% majority vote.

VI. OFFICERS:

A service board of officers shall consist of chairperson, vice chair/panel coordinator, secretary, literature coordinator, and alternate literature coordinator. Any officer who relapses will automatically be removed from board. Any officer who misses two consecutive subcommittee meetings will be removed from office, except by group waiver. If chairperson becomes unable to serve, vice chair assumes chairperson's duties until ASC approves new chair.

A. CHAIRPERSON REQUIREMENTS

1. Must have two years clean, one year H&I experience, and working knowledge of NA service structure.
2. Must reside in, attend meetings in and have phone number in S.C.A.N.A.
3. Must have knowledge of twelve steps, twelve traditions and 12 concepts of Narcotics Anonymous.
4. Must read, understand, and comply with SCA H&I guidelines.

B. CHAIRPERSON DUTIES

1. Conduct and guide the monthly SCA H&I sub-committee meeting using the agenda above.
2. Bring before the subcommittee matters that should be acted upon by the sub-committee in the new business section of the agenda.
3. Carry out the policies and orders for the subcommittee as well as that of the SCASC.
4. Attend monthly SCA H&I subcommittee meeting.
5. Attend monthly meeting of the SCASC on the last Sunday of each month at 6:30pm and give SCA H&I report to area.
6. Attend monthly Regional H&I subcommittee meeting at RSO in Monrovia on the 3rd Sunday of each month at 10:30am.
7. Maintain three years of S.C.A.N.A. H&I subcommittee minutes.

C. VICE CHAIR/PANEL COORDINATOR REQUIREMENTS

1. Must have two years clean, and one year H&I experience and working knowledge of NA service structure.
2. Must have knowledge of the twelve steps, twelve traditions and twelve concepts of Narcotics Anonymous.
3. Must read, understand, and comply with SCA H&I guidelines.
4. Is willing to serve as Chair the following year.

D. VICE CHAIR/PANEL COORDINATOR DUTIES

1. Act as chair, if chairperson is unable to attend service function, SCA H&I subcommittee meeting, SCASC meeting, or regional meeting.
2. Maintain regular contact with all facilities having S.C.A.N.A. H&I panels.
3. Must be willing to go over SCA H&I Orientation packet with new panel leaders and panel member/speakers after the sub-committee meeting each month.
4. Act as the liaison between the O.C.A.N.A. and the S.C.A.N.A.

Coordinates with O.C.A.N.A. to help staff any open panels in the O.C.A.N.A. if SCA H&I has the resources available.

E. SECRETARY REQUIREMENTS

1. Must have six months clean time.
2. Must have knowledge of the twelve steps, twelve traditions and twelve concepts of Narcotics Anonymous.
3. Must read, understand, and comply with SCA H&I guidelines.

F. SECRETARY DUTIES

1. Distribute paper copies of the previous month's minutes at the beginning of the current subcommittee meeting to all members.
2. Conducts verbal roll call and closed panel report during subcommittee meeting.
3. Record the minutes of the current subcommittee meeting.
4. Distribute blank contact list for new members and visitors to sign including name, clean-time, phone #, email, and any special facility clearance they have. Include that information in next month's minutes as well as adding info to current speaker list.
5. Keep updated records of all committee members' names, phone numbers, and email addresses.
6. Keep a list of the facilities covered by the SCA H&I panels including current contact names, including telephone # and email address.
7. Maintain and distribute current speaker phone lists, orientation packets, meeting minutes, and other pertinent information pertaining to SCA H&I sub-committee via email. To have a minimum of 5 paper copies of current speaker phone lists and orientation packets available at sub-committee meeting for panel leaders and/or panel members without email access.

G. PANEL LEADER REQUIREMENTS

1. Clean time requirement of one year unless additional clean time is required by the institution.
2. Minimum panel commitment length of one year.
3. Must attend two consecutive H&I meetings immediately prior to being voted into service position.
4. Is credited with proper clearance for the facility they cover.
5. Must have knowledge of the twelve steps, twelve traditions and twelve concepts of Narcotics Anonymous.
6. Must be willing to read, understand, and comply with SCA H&I guidelines.
7. Must use SCA H&I approved panel format for their meeting.
8. Must follow SCA H&I approved orientation packet and attend orientation.

9. If the panel leader cannot fulfill their commitment to bring in a panel/meeting into the facility and cannot find a substitute panel leader from the same facility, they must inform the vice-chair of the SCA H&I sub-committee immediately.

H. PANEL LEADER DUTIES

1. Invite panel members/speakers to the panel and do the necessary footwork to best accommodate the panel.
2. Screen all panel members/speakers to ensure that they meet facility & H&I requirements.
3. Go through the SCA H&I approved orientation packet with each panel member/speaker prior to the panel.
4. Communicate to the panel coordinator at any time during the month if a problem should arise at the panel.
5. Communicate to the panel coordinator if unable to present panel meeting or locate another panel leader to cover.
6. Communicate to the panel coordinator if unable to attend monthly meeting of SCA H&I and provide a report that the panel is being covered.
7. Attend monthly H&I subcommittee meeting. Two consecutive absences may result in removal as panel leader.
8. Obtain literature from subcommittee for distribution at panel.

I. LITERATURE COORDINATOR REQUIREMENTS

1. Must have six months clean.
2. Must have knowledge of the twelve steps, twelve traditions and twelve concepts of Narcotics Anonymous.
3. Must read, understand, and comply with SCA H&I guidelines.

J. LITERATURE COORDINATOR DUTIES

1. Bring literature to the monthly subcommittee meetings or arrange for literature to be at monthly meeting for distribution to panel leaders.
2. Provide panel leaders with literature order form at the beginning of H&I Meeting.
3. Fill literature orders for panel leaders based on supply.
4. Give brief literature report at SCA H&I meeting.
5. Order literature from SCRNA by email or fax each month for SCA H&I at least one week prior to regional H&I meeting which meets the 3rd Sunday of each month at SCRNA Regional Office in Monrovia.
6. Make sure that the SCA H&I Chair, Vice-Chair, or SCANA RCM will be picking up the literature or make other arrangements to ensure literature is delivered to the monthly meeting of SCA H&I.

7. Stamp all literature before or during the subcommittee meeting.

K. ALTERNATE LITERATURE COORDINATOR REQUIREMENTS

1. Must have six months clean.
2. Must have knowledge of the twelve steps, twelve traditions and twelve concepts of Narcotics Anonymous.
3. Must read, understand, and comply with SCA H&I guidelines.
4. Is willing to serve as Literature Coordinator the following year.

L. ALTERNATE LITERATURE COORDINATOR DUTIES

1. Assist Literature Coordinator with all duties at SCA H&I meeting each month.
2. Act as Literature Coordinator, if Literature Coordinator is unable to attend.

V. PANEL MEMBER/SPEAKER:

- A. Must have six months clean time or additional clean time if required by the facility.
- B. Must adhere to SCA H&I Orientation Packet as well as the following guidelines:
 1. Must be selected by panel leaders.
 2. Must be cleared by facility if necessary.
 3. Suggested not to mention any other fellowships by name.
 4. Cannot be anonymous as far as the facility is concerned.
 5. Must have a clear message of recovery in Narcotics Anonymous.
 6. Must dress appropriately.
 7. Must not to give out phone numbers to any person on the inside.
 8. Must do their best not to swear when speaking.
 9. Must not endorse facility.
 10. Must not comment on the facility's methods of treatment.
 11. Must not favor residents.
 12. Must not carry messages for residents.
 13. Must not carry contraband - cigarettes, knives, guns, etc.
 14. Must adhere to any further directions given by the panel leader.

VI. GENERAL GUIDELINES:

- A. All SCA H&I officers, panel leaders, panel members/speakers, guests, and visitors to SCA H&I sub-committee must be willing to read, understand, and comply with the SCA H&I sub-committee guidelines.

- B. All SCA H&I officers and panel leaders must attend monthly SCA H&I subcommittee meeting. Two consecutive absences from monthly meeting may be grounds for dismissal from service position.
- C. All SCA H&I officers and panel leaders must be voted in by the SCA H&I subcommittee.
- D. Panel leaders that let their panel assignment "go dark" without making proper attempts to have it covered may be asked to forfeit their service position.
- E. One panel leader from each facility should serve as the liaison between the panel coordinator and the facility to assure that facility needs are being met as well as NA traditions being upheld.
- F. Any member of the H&I subcommittee is automatically disqualified from further H&I activity upon relapse, but may again become eligible when he or she can conform to the requirements in these guidelines. Being clean for the purposes of the H&I subcommittee shall be defined as complete abstinence from all drugs.
- G. Any member who refuses to abide by the rules and regulations of the facility being served, shall automatically be relieved of any H&I subcommittee service position.
- H. Length of time clean required by each facility is to be rigidly upheld by all H&I panel leaders.
- I. All Narcotics Anonymous panels shall be conducted under the auspices of the SCA H&I subcommittee or its delegated leader.
- J. Any N.A. member who is involved with a given facility on a professional or volunteer basis should not participate in the panels serving the addicts in that facility. This is intended to avoid possible conflict and the resulting damage to: (A) The inmate or patient inside, or (B) the working ability and privilege of the subcommittee to carry the message inside the facility. For the same reason, no H&I member will interfere with or use influence in any facility, court or hospital, nor with any judge, doctor, probation or parole officer. Further, H&I members will not make any comments or promises regarding employment, parole, probation or medical problems. We carry only the message of Narcotics Anonymous: Recovery from addiction through our spiritual program is our only message.
- K. H&I panel members should be responsible for their conduct in any facility and must take responsibility to become informed in advance regarding the regulations of the facility being served.
- L. Clean and conservative clothing is strongly suggested.
- M. Excessive use of profanity or the use of vulgar stories in your sharing is strictly prohibited by the authorities of all facilities and strongly discouraged by the H&I subcommittee.
- N. You are reminded that the H&I subcommittee exists to share the Narcotics Anonymous message - our experience, strength and hope. H&I panel members should try to get residents involved with the meeting/presentation through reading materials as well as through direct sharing when applicable.

- O. SCA H&I subcommittee members should always keep in mind that he-she may be viewed as a representative of Narcotics Anonymous, and should conduct themselves responsibly.

VII. H&I PANELS

The primary purpose of Narcotics Anonymous H&I is to carry a clear message of recovery to addicts confined in correctional institutions, hospitals and/or recovery houses. This is accomplished through the operation of panels that visit them on a regular basis. These panels are comprised of panel leaders and panel members/speakers. New panels shall not be opened unless current panels are filled. (**Special clearance panels are excluded**)

- A. Any panel, or portion thereof, Special Clearance Panels included, that remains void of a panel leader for a period of three consecutive months shall be placed on the closed panel list maintained by the secretary. The panel will then be removed from the “**open panel list**” during the roll call of the following (4th) month.
- B. If the panel is being “**covered**” at the time of panel closure, the panel leader covering the panel will be given the opportunity to become the assigned panel leader. If the position is declined, the panel will then be moved to the “**closed panel list**” and will not be supported by the H & I Subcommittee.
- C. A panel on the “**closed panel list**” may be reinstated at any time on the “**open panel list**” in the event that a qualified panel leader expresses interest in committing to the panel leader position for that panel.
- D. Panels on the “**closed panel list**” should be announced prior to filling open panels during the monthly H & I Subcommittee Meeting.

VIII. FINANCES

SCA H & I has a current operating budget per month from the SCANA ASC which is as follows:

A. H & I Literature Buy & Expenses:	\$350.00
B. H & I Administrative Travel:	\$50.00
C. H & I Administrative Expenses	\$50.00

IX. SCA H&I Orientation Package

SCA H&I subcommittee has revised and modified the generic “sample panel member orientation package” to better suit the distinct needs of the SCANA. The revised document is called the SCANA H&I Subcommittee Orientation Packet and should be studied and considered when reviewing these guidelines to avoid and/or reduce redundancy in either document.

Initial Orientation

This H&I Orientation packet contains the information needed for N.A. members to become familiar with H&I work, so they aren't rushed into it without any preparation for this service. Many people are quite apprehensive about getting into H&I for a variety of reasons. Don't be put off; everyone has something to offer.

This packet has been compiled by the South Coast Area H&I subcommittee to give a brief outline of some of the specifics that will be important for you as a panel member and/or panel leader. The H&I Handbook gives a much more in-depth look at H&I work in Narcotics Anonymous if you decide you want to learn more about this rewarding type of service.

Many areas, as a part of orientation, bring those that are new to H&I to their first H&I panel/meeting or two as an observer. This offers the opportunity to just listen at first and see how an H&I panel/meeting really works. Also, this helps many to feel more comfortable when they come join the panel.

Personal Commitments-Panel Members/ Speakers

Please DO NOT volunteer for an H&I panel/meeting if:

1. You are not sure that you want to attend, or
2. You are not sure you will be able to attend the panel/meeting.
 - A. If something comes up and you will be unable to make it, try to give the panel leader at least 48 hours notice, so that he/she can invite someone else to fill your spot. DO NOT ask someone to take your place or even to come along with you to the meeting. **THE PANEL LEADER IS THE ONLY ONE ALLOWED TO INVITE PEOPLE TO THE PANEL/MEETING.**

H&I Requirements for Panel Speakers/Members

You have been invited to carry the message of recovery through H&I meetings/presentations because:

1. You have at least 6 months abstinence from all drugs.
2. You have a [clear](#) N.A. message of recovery from addiction.

3. You seem willing to comply with all of the H&I subcommittee's and the facility's requirements.
4. You are willing to carry the message in a responsible way.

The Panel/Meeting Format

There are a variety of formats that we use when carrying the message into facilities, but there are some key points to keep in mind about all of them.

The format of any particular H&I panel/meeting may vary from meeting-to-meeting depending on the type of facility. In short term facilities, the format will be more focused on the panel members carrying a message in to the residents, while at a long term facility we may encourage more participation from the residents. In H&I, we carry the message into the facility. At an H&I meeting we are not there to dump our problems, but rather to help these addicts become aware of what N.A. is and how it works in our lives. In effect, an H&I meeting is an introduction to our fellowship for addicts.

The panel leader should let the speaker/member know what the format is before the panel/meeting and should be able to answer any questions you may have about it. If you would like to see samples of a variety of formats, there is an explanation of several of them in the H&I Handbook. (Attached are 2 examples of commonly used formats.)

Whatever format is chosen, we normally get the residents involved with a question and answer session at some point in the panel/meeting; it is recommended to save this until the end. Please allow 5 to 10 minutes for questions and please remind them this time is for questions not sharing.

Questions and Answers

It is a good idea to encourage questions concerning what was presented at the panel/meeting or other general questions about N.A., but here are a few things you should keep in mind.

Please remember that **Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues.** Occasionally during the question and answer period or when talking after the meeting/presentation, the residents will ask us to give an opinion on outside issues such as:

1. Other recovery programs or fellowships
2. The facility, i.e., "Do I need to stay in treatment?"
3. Many other issues that do not pertain to recovery from addiction in the Narcotics Anonymous Fellowship.

It is very important that we are not drawn into these types of discussions!! Always remember to only share your experience, strength and hope about **YOUR** recovery in Narcotics Anonymous.

Working with Others: Men with Men, Women with Women

Some facilities house only men or only women. Other facilities house both men and women, but keep them separate. In these facilities, where your panels/meetings will consist of only men or only women, we feel strongly that only same-sex Narcotics Anonymous members should participate. Remember, our primary purpose is to carry the message of recovery, not to make our meetings more popular with the addicts we are trying to help. Problems that arise in this area have the potential to seriously damage the credibility of Narcotics Anonymous. Experience has taught us that we can avoid these problems if we follow this simple guideline.

Adolescents

When adolescents are referred to in this handbook, we are referring to anyone under the legal age of majority in your state or country. We need to remember that adolescents are prospective members, and should be treated with respect. When sharing in an H&I panel/meeting, we need to remember that to an adolescent, the stress experienced due to peer pressure or the relationship with their parents and/or teacher may be just as much a crisis to them as losing a job, marriage, or house may be to others. In N.A., we learn to deal with our feelings and emotions and share with others how we have been able to work through them by utilizing the **Twelve Steps of Narcotics Anonymous**.

Due to the governmental statutes regarding adolescents, we need to be especially aware of facilities' rules and regulations as they relate to our interaction with these prospective members. For example, some facilities may require a staff member to be present during meetings/presentations. One suggestion we may make to administrators of facilities for adolescents is that they make attendance at the H&I meeting voluntary. We have found this reduces distraction, increasing the opportunity for recovery in the Narcotics Anonymous Fellowship.

While some people maintain that adolescents respond better to people closer to their own age, the bulk of our experience suggest that the age of the person sharing at an adolescent H&I meeting is secondary to their ability to share a strong, clear message of recovery. Adolescents seem to respond more to the message than to the messenger. All H&I meetings are highly structured and should be geared towards recovery through the **12 Steps of Narcotics Anonymous**. Our experience has shown that we do not need to use a special format when carrying the message to adolescents.

In addition to the Dos and Don'ts found at the end of this package, we feel that the following should be included and paid extra close attention to when addressing adolescents.

ADOLESCENT DO's & DON'Ts

DO's	
DO	Remember that this is a "we" program. No addict should feel that he/she is being preached to.
DO	Remember that an addict is an addict, regardless of age.
DO	Tell them that there is fun in recovery, i.e., social events, fellowship, etc.
DO	Acknowledge and validate their feelings and emotions

DON'Ts	
DON'T	Glorify your past.
DON'T	In meetings with adolescents, don't say, "I feel like I'm talking to my kids."
DON'T	Compare your bottom to theirs.
DON'T	Patronize adolescents.
DON'T	Use profanity

**GENERAL
DO's and DON'Ts**

DO's	
DO	Make schedules of outside meetings available to residents.
DO	Clarify the facility's rules with anyone you bring in.
DO	Try to get all agreements with the facility in writing
DO	Start and end on time.
DO	Briefly explain what H&I is.
DO	Make it clear that N.A. is separate and distinct from the facility as well as other fellowships.
DO	Obey all dress codes.
DO	Keep staff aware of your whereabouts at all times.
DO	Stamp all literature you bring into a facility with local help line number.
DO	Screen all panel members carefully, especially regarding their clean time or other requirements.
DO	Explain the language that we use ("addict", "clean", "recovery") and why we use it. (The 1 st Step of N.A. and the 6 th Tradition of N.A.)
DO	Emphasize that N.A. recovery is available to any addict, regardless of "type" of drug(s) used.
DO	Follow all security regulations at all times.
DO	Contact the facility contact person and let them know they can purchase literature from SCASC, RSO, or WSO www.southcoastareana.com ; www.todayna.org ; www.na.org
DO	Inform the contact person that we have literature order forms available for their use.
DO	Emphasize the importance of getting a sponsor and a home group, the ongoing nature of recovery, and the importance of attending meetings (suggest 90 meetings in 90 days upon discharge and/or release)
DO	Use the literature recommended for H&I works, if we are supplying the literature. Encourage the treatments centers to supply N.A. literature on their own if at all possible.

DON'Ts	
DON'T	Comment on the methods used by the treatment facility. Not all facilities are 12 Step based nor do their understanding of the Steps necessarily coincide with the understanding gained in N.A. We share our experience without reference to the facility's methods or to the resident's comments.
DON'T	Debate the merits of the treatment center's program or other Fellowships'. Remember, we have no opinion on outside issues.

	(10 th Tradition) The best approach is to focus on the positive and unique qualities of our program. Keep your Basic Text handy and read from it. It is the foundation of our program of recovery.
DON'T	Break another person's anonymity or tell his/her story.
DON'T	Debate issues involving the facility's rules or regulations.
DON'T	Get involved in discussions on outside issues, remember why we are there.
DON'T	While sharing, pay too much focus on what it was like. They already know.
DON'T	Debate which drugs are acceptable. N.A. is a program of complete abstinence from ALL drugs.
DON'T	Discuss conditions within facility, or opinions about staff members.
DON'T	Carry excessive cash or wear expensive or flashy jewelry.
DON'T	Show favoritism to any resident (s).
DON'T	Take messages in or out of the facility.
DON'T	Give out your or any other person's address or phone number.
DON'T	Carry in any contraband items, such as cell phones, cigarettes, or weapons
DON'T	Give residents money
DON'T	Give or accept gifts.
DON'T	Carry letters in or out of the facility.
DON'T	Take a member who has friends or family in the facility.
DON'T	Get involved in a discussion about an inmate's guilt or innocence.
DON'T	Rely on "flooding" a facility with literature to carry our message. The most powerful tool for carrying our message is the N.A. member.
DON'T	Read too many literature selections at the beginning of the meeting. Keep it short and simple to keep their attention.
DON'T	Let the meeting run too long. (Most treatment center residents spend much of their day in meetings of one sort or another, often in the same room.)
DON'T	Collect any money.
DON'T	Use excessive profanity.

GENERAL RULES

1. It is a felony to bring any drugs or weapons onto the grounds of any institution.
2. It is against the law to give money to an inmate in the Orange County Jail, or Joplin Honor Ranch.
3. It is prohibited to bring money into the Orange County Jail to exchange for articles made by inmates.
4. It is prohibited to accept any articles, including correspondence of any kind from inmates. No exceptions.
5. It is prohibited to give money to members of a detoxification, rehabilitation, shelter, or any other institution that SCA H & I services.
6. If smoking is permitted at a facility, panel leaders and panel members/speakers may partake but are prohibited to leave additional cigarettes, lighters, or matches behind.

7. No Narcotics Anonymous panel regularly conducted under the auspices of the Subcommittee shall be held in any institutions, except under the direct supervision of a regularly delegated panel leader or substitute specifically delegated by the panel leader or coordinator.
8. No member will involve himself/herself with any other activity at any institution that this Subcommittee serves, to avoid possible conflict and resulting damage to: a) the inmate or patient on the inside; and b) the working ability and the privilege of this Subcommittee to carry the message inside the institution.
9. No member will interfere with or use any influence in any institutions, courts, or hospitals, nor with any judge, doctor, probation officer or parole officer. Nor will he/she make any comments or promises regarding employment, parole or medical problems. We carry only the message of Narcotics Anonymous—recovery through spiritual principles.
10. NA case histories, life stories, and/or NA principles or NA general information are to be the main topics of NA panels conducted within all institutions served by this Subcommittee. All speakers and panel members must strictly comply with this regulation, confining their talks solely to the NA message of recovery.

Remember at all times that you have a responsibility to the facility, to the residents, and to N.A. If you observe and follow the above suggestions, and follow the Twelve Traditions of N.A., you will uphold your responsibilities to all three.
